

1 No judicial review of Minister's actions in any circumstances

- (1) The Parliament states that the object of this section is to prevent any sort of judicial review of any action taken by the Minister under this Act and in order to achieve this object the Parliament states that however unreasonable or unjust the outcome may be, this section is to prevail over any other Act or law.
- (2) No court may review any action of the Minister taken or purportedly taken under this Act regardless of whether that action is unreasonable, irrational, corrupt or criminal and regardless of whether that action tramples on the rights of any person including fundamental human rights, common law rights or any other form of protection offered to the person by law.
- (3) Action of the Minister is taken under this Act if the Minister declares that the action is taken under this Act regardless of whether the action is actually taken under this Act.
- (4) A declaration under this section may be made by the Minister at any time.
- (5) In this section:

action includes an omission.

court means a court, tribunal or any other person or body exercising any sort of judicial function.

review includes challenge, quash or call into question.
